PATIENT INFORMATION LEAFLET

Please read this leaflet carefully before you start using this medicine. It tells you the important points you should know about XYLONOR SPRAY.

Pharmaceutical form

Metered aerosol

What's in your medicine

This solution contains 10 mg of lidocaine and 0.1 mg of cetrimide per metered dose.

It is a clear colourless to slightly yellow liquid with an odour of mint.

It also includes other ingredients: saccharin, natural mint flavour, dipropylene glycol and ethylic alcohol 95 % (v/v).

XYLONOR SPRAY is available in metered dose aerosol containing 36 g of solution.

About your medicine

XYLONOR SPRAY contains two active ingredients. These include an anaesthetic and an antiseptic agent. This medicine can only be given to you by your dentist. It is most commonly used to obtain a local anaesthesia of the buccal mucosa.

Before this medicine is used

Before this solution is used, tell your dentist if:

- you have been given this product before and had an allergic reaction (rashes, swelling, itching or difficulty in breathing),
- you are pregnant or breast-feeding,
- if you are taking any other medicines, including those you have bought yourself without prescription,
- the patient is a child under 3 years of age,
- you are sensitive to any of the ingredients contained in XYLONOR SPRAY.

How this medicine will be used

Your dentist knows how to use XYLONOR SPRAY. He will give you the dose needed, which depends on the treatment you are having.

One to two metered doses are usually sufficient to achieve anaesthesia on a particular site. Your dentist will spray it onto the buccal mucosa.

If you see another dentist or go into hospital, tell them what medicines you are taking.

What to do if an overdose is taken

If you (or someone else) swallow a lot of the solution, or if you think a child has swallowed any of the solution, contact your nearest hospital casualty department or dentist immediately.

Unwanted effects

XYLONOR SPRAY, like most other medicines, may cause side effects in some patients. Most side effects are nothing to worry about. If you develop any side effects as skin rash or itching or hives in the mouth, dizziness, nervousness, blurred vision, tremors or feeling faint, contact your dentist.

Storing your medicine

It is most unlikely that you will be given this medicine to look after. Your dentist will not take any solution after the expiry date printed on the container. If you have any medicines that are out of date, return them to your pharmacist for disposal.

Keep all medicines in a safe place out of the reach of children.

This aerosol will be stored below 25° C by your dentist.

Do not keep any medicines you no longer need ; give them back to your pharmacist for disposal.

Further information

Remember, this medicine is only for you. Only a dentist can prescribe it for you. Never give it to anyone else, even if it sound as though they have the same problem as you. It may harm them.

This leaflet provides only a summary of the information known about XYLONOR SPRAY. If you have any questions, want to know more about this medicine, or are unsure about anything, ask your dentist.
